PUBLIC HEARING TO CONSIDER COLLECTION OF SEWER SERVICE CHARGES ON THE TAX ROLLS FOR FISCAL YEAR 2023 AND ADOPTION OF A RESOLUTION ELECTING TO COLLECT SEWER SERVICE CHARGES ON THE TAX ROLLS

This item was reviewed by the Budget & Finance Committee. Business Services Manager/CFO Carlson stated the Board must hold a public hearing annually to consider and authorize collection of sewer services charges on the tax rolls. The report setting forth sewer service charges to be assessed on each parcel in the District for the 2023 Fiscal Year was prepared by staff and was available for public inspection at the District office. The public hearing notice was published in the Argus newspaper June 17 and June 24, 2022 and was also published in the Tri-City Voice newspaper on June 14 and June 21, 2022. Business Services Manager/CFO Carlson recommended the Board conduct a public hearing to receive written and oral comments on the proposal to collect sewer service charges via the property tax rolls and consider adoption of a resolution electing to collect sewer service charges on the tax rolls.

President Lathi opened the public hearing at 4:11 p.m. and directed staff to allow five minutes for comments to be received from the public.

At 4:16 p.m., Board Clerk McEvoy stated no comments nor protests had been received. President Lathi closed the public hearing.

Technical Services Manager Chau stated the Board awarded the construction contract for the Project to Casey Construction on April 26, 2021. Staff issued the Notice to Proceed to Casey on June 8, 2021, and the project was completed October 22, 2021. CONSIDER ADOPTION OF A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE USE OF TELECONFERENCE MEETINGS IN COMPLIANCE WITH AB 361

District Counsel Murphy stated AB 361 requires public agencies to make findings by majority vote within 30 days of the first teleconferenced meeting under AB 361 and every 30 days thereafter that a state of emergency still exists and continues to directly impact the ability of the members to meet safely in person, or that officials continue to impose or recommend measures to promote social distancing. The District is continuing to hold teleconferenced meetings as allowed under AB 361 due to the ongoing public health threat of COVID-19. Recommendation

Staff recommends the Board consider and approve: 1) a refreshed District logo, nickname, and descriptor 2) direct staff to move forward with the implementation plan for the logo 3) provide direction regarding the District's website and email addresses.

Discussion

Refreshed District Logo, Nickname, and Descriptor

Staff presented a modified version of the final branding concept at Board Workshops held in May and June of 2022:



Should the Board approve this item, staff plans to incorporate the refreshed logo into the District's Fall 2022 Newsletter.

Implementation Plan

Should the Board approve the logo, staff is proposing the following implementation plan:

• Staff will immediately order decals for hard hats and District vehicles. Decals will be applied to District vehicles over the next six months.

- Staff will reach out to City of Union City staff to begin the process of replacing directional street signs. Estimated timeline is to be determined.
- New uniform patches will be designed and ordered. Staff will work with our vendor to affix the new patches to District uniforms.
- New business cards will be ordered as needed. The District plans to exhaust current supplies before ordering.
- Logo apparel for employees will be included in the annual employee recognition event, which is currently anticipated to be held in September or October of this year.

District Website and Email Addresses

Staff explored potential domain names for the District website and email addresses. Modifying the District's current ".ca.gov" nomenclature to anything other than unionsanitary turned out not to be an option. The Board may choose to retain the District's current website and email addresses or may choose to proceed with one of the following options currently available (listed in no particular order):

- 1. usdwastewater.org
- 2. usdww.org
- 3. wastewaterusd.org
- 4. usdtricityww.org
- 5. tricitywastewater.org
- 6. usdtricitywastewater.org

Alternately, usd.org is available for a price of \$50,000. Staff is not recommending this option due to the cost. However, if the Board would like to pursue this option, staff can offer a lower bid and potentially enter negotiations to attempt to secure the domain.

At least 13 Bay Area special districts and District affiliated organizations use .org for their website and email addresses.

Background

Staff has worked with Pier 2 Marketing since January 2018 to develop branding concepts. The Board provided feedback to options developed by Pier 2 during a series of workshops where several rounds of edits and additional options were requested. The Board narrowed options and directed the internal branding task force to make the final selection. District staff participated in a survey to select the final branding concept, which has since been modified to preserve Union Sanitary District's legal name.

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Introduction Who we are

Union Sanitary District operates a 33-acre wastewater treatment facility in Union City and provides collection, treatment, and disposal services to a total population of over 356,000 in Fremont, Newark and Union City, California. The District maintains over 830 miles of underground pipeline in its service area. The District was formed in 1918 and reorganized under the Sanitary District Act of 1923.

Our mission is to safely and responsibly collect and treat wastewater, and to recover resources from process waste streams, while protecting human health and improving the environment in a way that benefits the Tri-Cities and all USD stakeholders. USD uses a strategic planning process to align District operations to best complete our mission.

Union Sanitary District is synonymous with quality work. Our highly skilled and qualified labor force is the cornerstone to the overall public health and success of the communities we serve.

Logo Visual identity

It's important to maintain proper spacing around the logo to keep the brand feeling clean.

Minimal clear space

It helps to always surround the logo with an area we call "minimum clear space."

This refers to the area indicated by the dotted line surrounding the logo, and is designed to keep the logo free from interfering text, other graphic elements and images.

The minimum clear space of the horizontal logo is calculated by taking a measurement that relates to the icon, as indicated here.



Logo Variations

There are three possible ways to display the logo.

One vertical and two horizontal ones.

For the horizontal orientation we offer two ways to display the date of establishment.

The colored logo on a white background is the preferred application. Alternatively, the logo has two options for its application on a gray scale, or a white and black option.

No other brand element is a more powerful visual representation of the brand than the color palette.

The main palette consists of Pantone 302 C, Pantone 2455 C, Pantone 2241 C, and three additional tones. These primary colors act as important identifiers to help distinguish the USD brand. The Primary color is displayed most frequently across screens and components and is used for:

- Key actions, such as call to action buttons
- Highlighted content/Focused elements

The other colors in our palette are used as text colors, backgrounds, shadows and highlights. They are also used to aid with legibility.

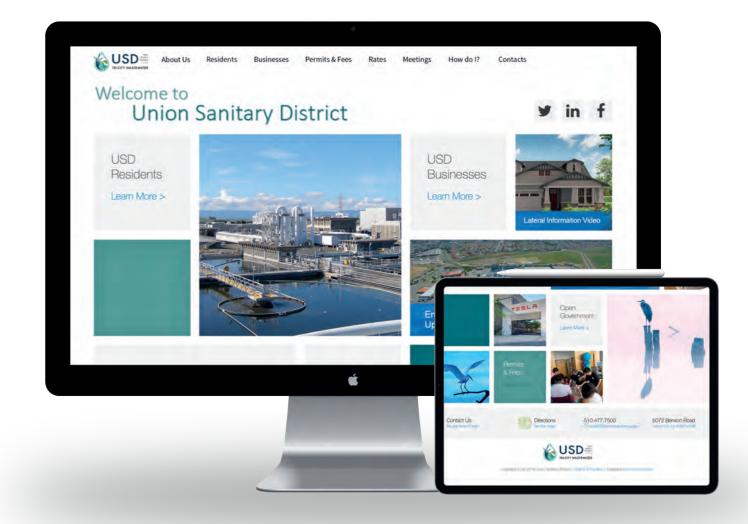

Two Board Members to the Committee (This is a Motion Item)

SUBMITTED: Paul R. Eldredge, General Manager/District Engineer

Recommendation

Staff recommends the Board consider creating an Investment/Portfolio ad hoc committee and appointing two Board members to the ad hoc committee.

Discussion

Quarterly, the Districts portfolio manager, PFM, provides a report outlining the performance of the District's investments. These quarterly reports are reviewed by the Budget and Finance Committee prior to Board meetings and are typically one of several items discussed.

An in-depth comprehensive overview of the quarterly report is not feasible due to the scheduling and time constraints of the Committee. Thus, a very high-level abridged overview is presented at the Committee and Board meetings.

Given the current economic state and number of factors that could influence the District's portfolio (inflation, federal monetary policies, worst investing environment since 1970) a more in-depth review of the District's portfolio might be prudent. Staff is proposing the creation of a temporary investment/portfolio ad-hoc with primary focus being the review of the quarterly reports (at a minimum) to provide an opportunity for a more in-depth review of the report and any corresponding Q&A. Staff would continue presenting the abridged overview to the entire Board on a quarterly basis.

Staff shared this concept with PFM staff, and they fully endorse the concept and the opportunity for a more in-depth review of these reports as well as any other related discussions.

Background

Ad hoc committees are temporary advisory committees composed solely of less than a quorum of the legislative body that serves a limited or single purpose, is not perpetual, and will dissolve once its specific task is completed. Ad hoc committees are not subject to the Brown Act. Given its limited and temporary purpose, the Investment/Portfolio Ad Hoc Committee would not be subject to the Brown Act.

The need for continuation of the Investment/Portfolio Committee or the change to a permanent internal Investment/Portfolio Committee subject to the Brown Act, as well as appointments, would be considered annually along with appointments to internal Board committees. There is no need to revise Policy 3070, Boardmember Officers and Committee Membership, as Ad Hoc Committees are temporary.

The Ad Hoc will meet as needed, but no less than quarterly in correlation to the PFM reports.

Recommendation

Staff recommends the Board consider a resolution to accept a sanitary sewer easement and quitclaim part of two sanitary sewer easements for the Fremont Convention Center, located at 46399 Fremont Boulevard, in the City of Fremont.

Discussion

The developer, Surya Real Estate, LLC, is planning to construct a conference/convention and banquet facility that includes a 56,044 square-foot building on a 3.1-acre lot at 46399 Fremont Boulevard, in the City of Fremont. A District 48-inch trunk main passes through the western portion of the subject parcel and resides within a 10-foot easement. Along the east side of the 10-foot easement is a 15-foot easement that was for a 15-inch sanitary sewer main that was abandoned in the 1990s. The planned convention center building will encroach upon the vacant 15-foot easement and the City requires that, with the District's approval, the easement be quitclaimed before permits for the project will be issued. District staff determined that sufficient District access to the 48-inch trunk main and clearance for the convention center building could be achieved by replacing both the 15-foot and 10-foot easements with a new 20-foot easement centered over the 48-inch trunk main within the parcel. A vicinity map is attached.

A legal description and plat map have been prepared for the grant of easement. Legal descriptions and plat maps have also been prepared for the quitclaim of the portion of both easements within the parcel. District staff has reviewed the documents and recommends approval.

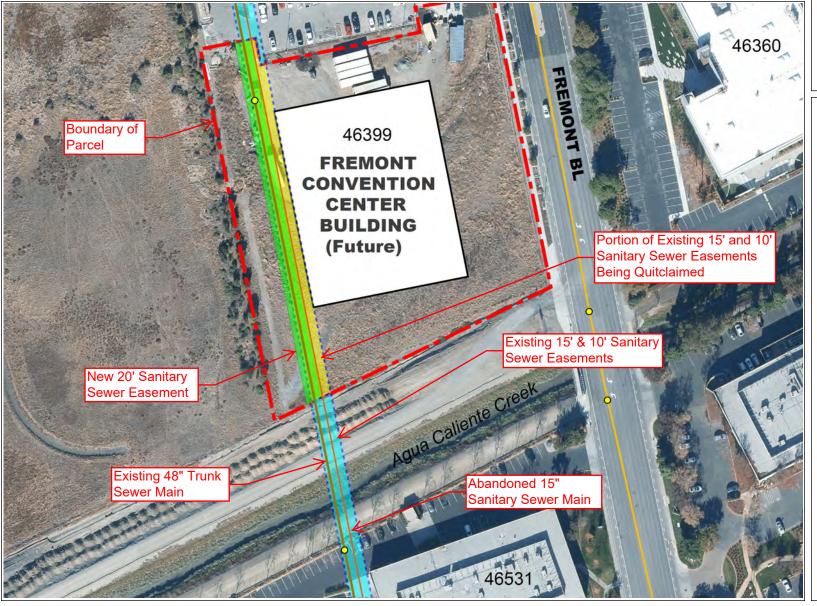

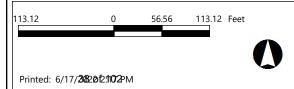

GRANT OF SANITARY SEWER EASEMENT

This Grant of Sanitary Sewer Easement (the "Agreement") is made and entered into as of Tune, 24th, 2022 ("Effective Date"), by and between SURYA REAL ESTATE, LLC, a limited liability company ("Grantor") and UNION SANITARY DISTRICT, a sanitary district organized under the laws of the State of California ("Grantee"). Grantor and Grantee may each be referred to as a "Party" or collectively as the "Parties."

RECITALS

- A. Grantor is the fee owner of that certain real property located at 46399 Fremont Boulevard in the City of Fremont, County of Alameda, State of California, identified as Parcel 2 of Parcel Map 10362, recorded May 26, 2016, as Document Number 2016133258 of Almeda County Records, APN 519-850-129, and more particularly described and depicted in Exhibit A attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference ("Grantor Property").
- B. Union Sanitary District ("USD") desires to obtain an easement over a portion of the Grantor Property for sanitary sewer pipe and related appurtenances in order to effectuate the development of Tract 8205 consisting of multifamily residential buildings on separate lots.
- C. The Parties enter into this Agreement to provide USD with a recorded easement for a sanitary sewer pipe and any related appurtenances and for ingress to and egress from the easement area and over Grantor Property.

AGREEMENT

NOW, THEREFORE, for good and valuable consideration, receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, the Parties agree as follows:

1. Grant of Sanitary Sewer Easement. 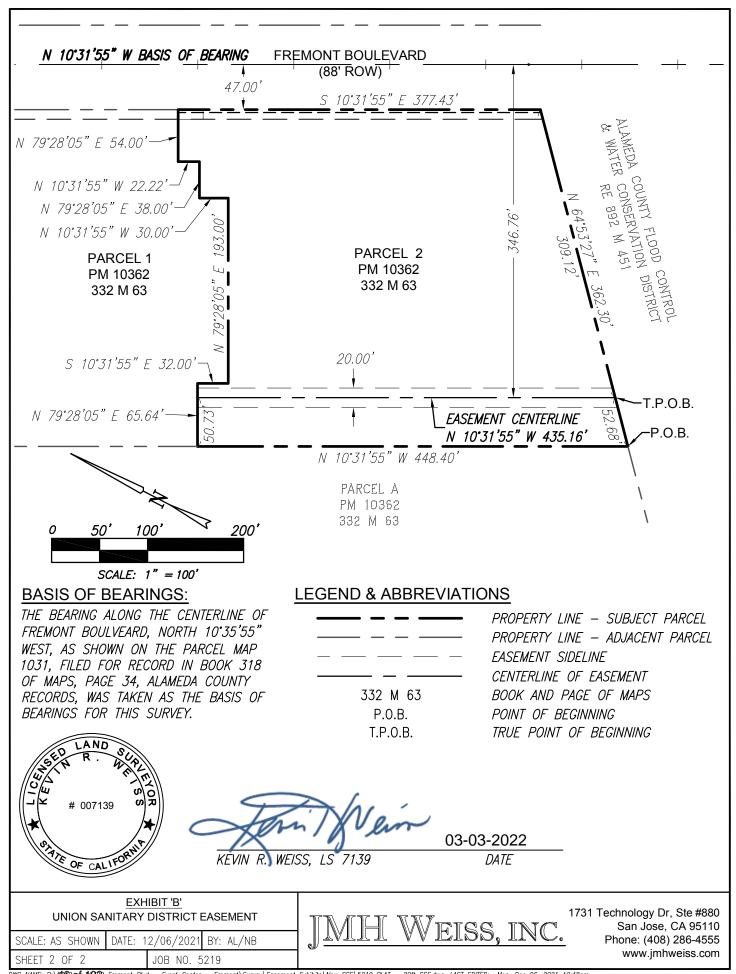

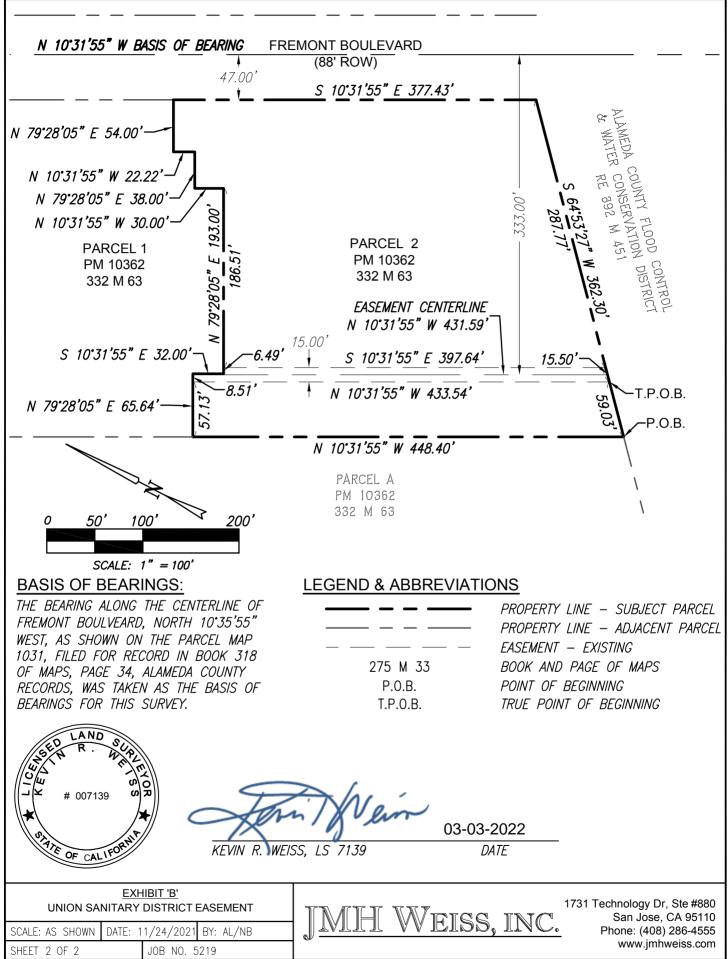

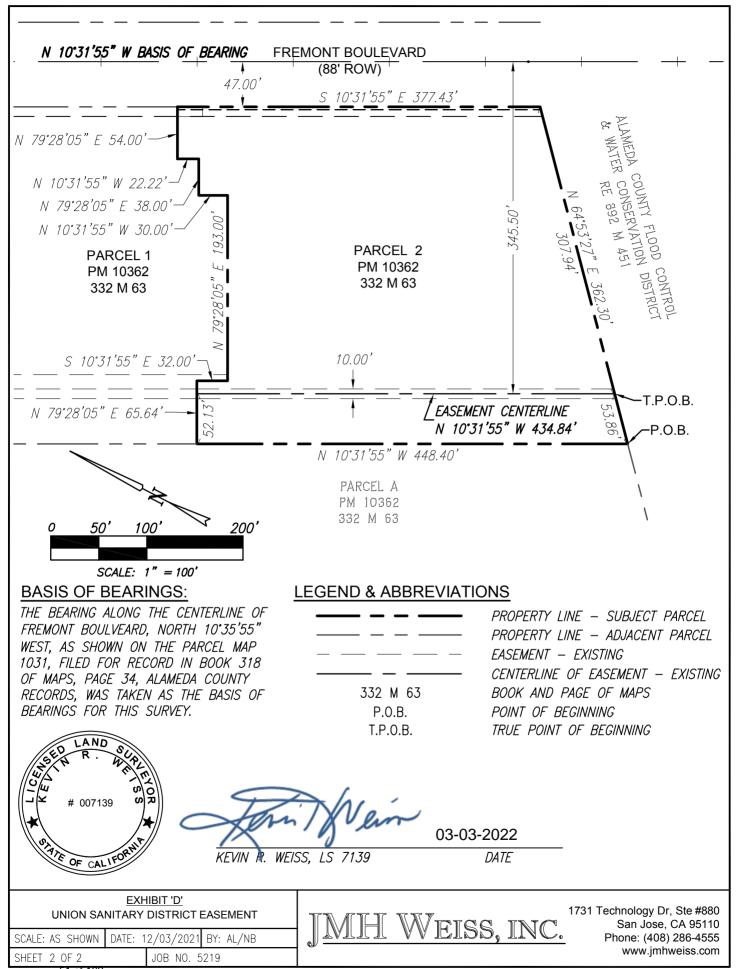

Discussion

Caltrans has requested that the District quitclaim a vacant portion of a 10-foot sanitary sewer easement that is located on a City owned parcel within the right-of-way for State Route 262 – Mission Boulevard. The easement was granted to the District in 1979 for an 8-inch sanitary sewer main constructed beside the eastern boundary of the Union Pacific Railroad corridor to the northern edge of Mission Boulevard where the sewer turned westward and passed under the railway corridor to Kato Road. In 2004, the District relocated the sewer under the railway as part of the I-880/Mission Boulevard/Warren Avenue Interchange Project which resulted in a portion of the 10-foot easement becoming vacant after the sewer main in the easement was abandoned. A vicinity map is attached.

A legal description and plat map have been prepared for the quitclaim of a portion of the easement. District staff has reviewed the documents and recommends approval.

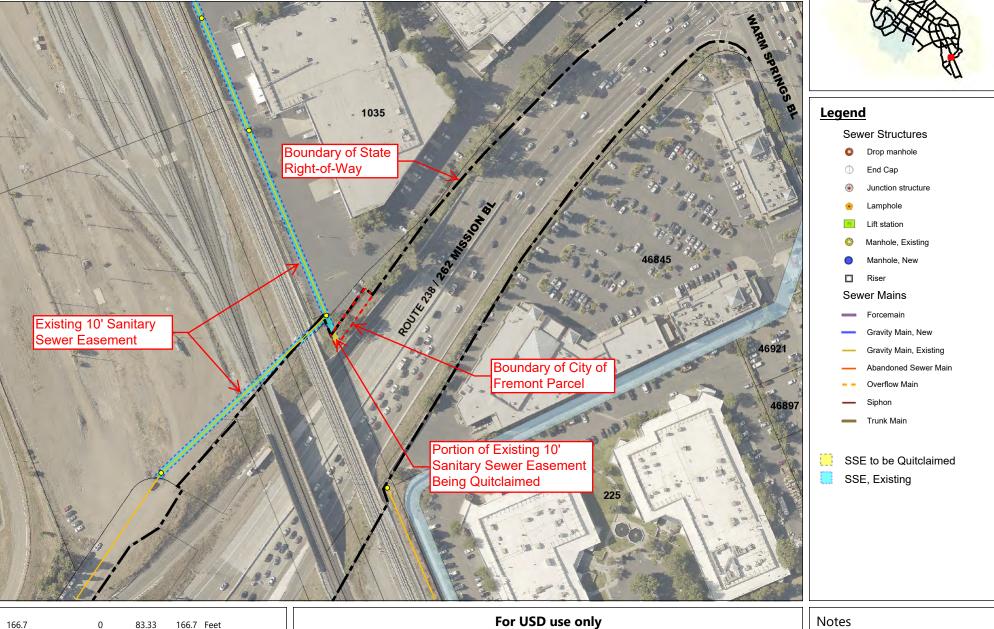

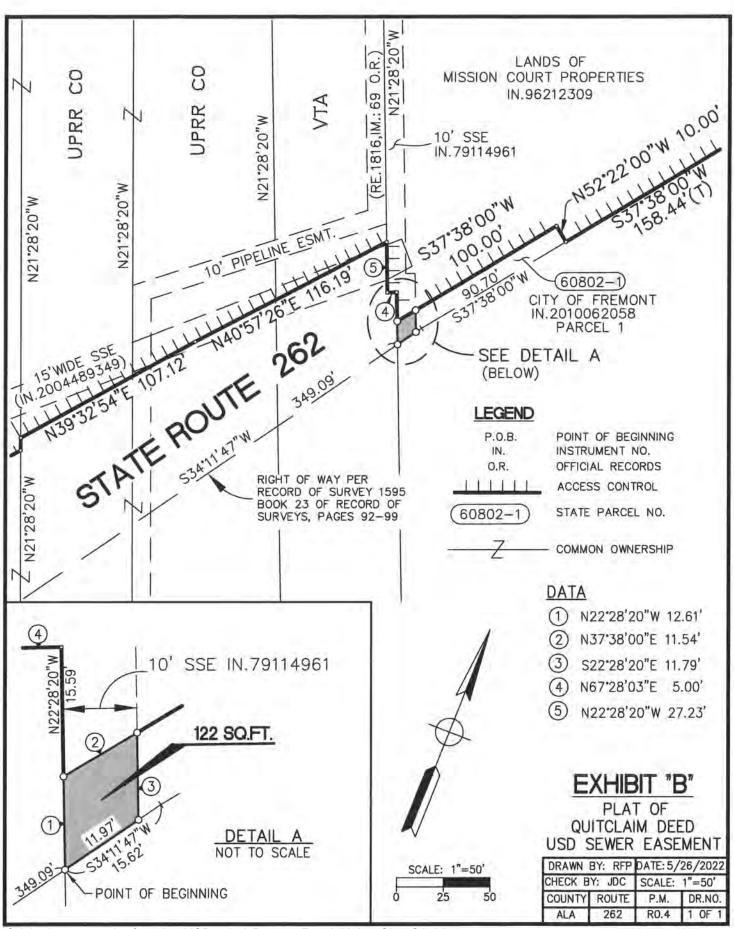

Recommendation

Staff recommends the Board consider a resolution to accept the construction of the Cathodic Protection System Improvements Project (Project) from Corrpro Companies, Inc. (Corrpro) and authorize recordation of a Notice of Completion.

Discussion

Staff issued the Notice to Proceed to Corrpro on June 8, 2021. The 210-day project was initially scheduled to be completed on January 3, 2022. Corrpro completed the Project on January 21, 2022. The delay was due to the rectifier equipment arriving later than scheduled due to material supply chain impacts from COVID.

Change Orders

The Project included 2 CCOs in the credit amount of \$33,513.58, which is approximately -6.9% of the original contract amount of \$483,800. A list of the CCOs is included in the attached Table 1. A summary of the CCOs is provided below:

1. CCO No. 1 was in the credit amount of \$33,513.58. An existing 250-foot-deep anode well at the Plant was scheduled to be abandoned. Because the well is located next to an

electrical ductbank, the contractor felt they could not abandon the well without interfering with the ductbank. After evaluating the situation, staff decided the abandonment work wasn't worth the risk of damaging the ductbank. Since the State of California, industry best practice, and ACWD prefer but do not require the well to be abandoned, staff felt it was prudent to delete the work from the Project.

2. CCO No. 2 was executed at no cost with a non-compensable time extension of 18 calendar days that revised the Project's substantial completion date to January 21, 2022. The rectifier equipment arrived at the site later than scheduled due to material supply chain impacts from COVID. This delay resulted in the contractor completing the installation and system tests 18 days after the Project's original completion date.

Background

The District operates cathodic protection systems to protect its underground steel and iron pipelines and appurtenances from corrosion. These systems are located at the Alvarado Wastewater Treatment Plant (Plant), Newark Pump Station (PS), Irvington PS, and sites where the twin force main pipelines and steel casings cross under major roadways and railroads. The cathodic protection systems are a combination of sacrificial anodes installed in shallow excavations and anodes installed in a deep well and energized using a rectifier. The type of system is dependent on the quantity and proximity of steel and iron pipelines within an area. The cathodic protection systems are designed to sacrificially degrade the anodes and impede corrosion of the pipelines.

Staff annually tests and measures the cathodic protection systems to monitor the effectiveness of the anodes and rectifiers. In 2018, the District hired JDH to review the data and evaluate the condition of the cathodic protection systems. JDH presented its findings and recommendations in the 2018 Annual Survey and Cathodic Protection Condition Assessment Report (Report). The Report provided a plan to repair, replace, or upgrade the existing cathodic protection systems during the next 10 years.

Newark Pump Station Cathodic Protection System

The cathodic protection system improvements at the Newark PS were one of the recommendations in the Report. The Newark PS system, which consists entirely of sacrificial anodes in shallow excavations, was installed in 2004 as part of the Pump Station Force Main Corrosion Repairs Project. JDH found that most of the sacrificial anodes were nearly depleted. New anodes were recommended to be installed for corrosion protection of the underground steel pipelines which range in diameters between 24-inches and 48-inches. The cathodic protection pipeline test station terminal boards were also recommended to be replaced.

The Newark Pump Station Cathodic Protection System Upgrade Project was advertised for bids on February 12, 2019. Two bids were received and opened on March 12, 2019 from Corrpro and Farwest Corrosion Control Company (Farwest). Corrpro was the apparent low bidder. Staff

reviewed the bid and found it to be non-responsive. On April 22, 2019, the Board rejected all bids received for this project and authorized staff to re-bid it.

The Newark Pump Station Cathodic Protection System Upgrade Project was re-advertised for bids on May 14, 2019. One bid was received and opened on June 11, 2019 from Farwest. Farwest was the sole bidder with a total bid amount 110% above the Engineer's Estimate. Since Farwest's bid was the only bid received and exceeded the Engineer's Estimate by a large percentage, staff believed it would be best to reject Farwest's bid. On June 24, 2019, the Board rejected the sole bid received for this project.

The improvements for the Newark Pump Station Cathodic Protection System Upgrade Project were subsequently included in the current Cathodic Protection System Improvements Project. Staff had anticipated more favorable bids for a larger project that combined cathodic protection system improvements at the Plant and Newark PS. Please refer to Figure 1 for the location of the improvements at the Newark PS.

<u>Treatment Plant Cathodic Protection System</u>

One of the Report's recommendations was to replace seven oil-cooled rectifiers with air-cooled rectifiers. The oil-cooled rectifiers were in poor condition, tended to overheat, and were hard to maintain due to the difficulty in replacing the oil. The seven oil-cooled rectifiers were located near the following structures in the Plant:

- Headworks Building
- Primary Clarifiers 1-4 Building
- West Blower Building
- Control Box No. 3
- Alvarado Effluent Pump Station
- Thickener No. 3
- Thickener No. 4

The Report also recommended replacing the deep anode well located at the Heating and Mixing Building No. 3 because the anodes are nearly depleted. A new deep anode well was recommended to be installed, and the existing deep anode well to be "destroyed" pursuant to the California Well Standards issued by the California Department of Water Resources. Additionally, the Report also recommended an inactive deep anode well located at the West Blower Building be "destroyed" as it was replaced with a new deep anode well several years ago. Please refer to Figure 2 for the location of the improvements at the Plant.

Project Scope

JDH provided design services for the Newark Pump Station Cathodic Protection System Project when it was previously bid. V&A Consulting Engineers completed the design of improvements to the Plant's cathodic protection system. The Project's scope includes:

Plant

- Replacement of seven existing oil-cooled rectifiers with air-cooled rectifiers located throughout the Plant.
- Installation of one new 250-foot-deep anode well located east of the Heating and Mixing Building No. 3.
- Destruction of two existing deep anode wells located near the Heating and Mixing Building No. 3 and the West Blower Building pursuant to the California Well Standards issued by the California Department of Water Resources.

Newark PS

- Installation of new buried (shallow depth) sacrificial anodes at 10 locations to protect the underground steel pipelines which range in diameters from 24 to 48 inches.
- Replacement of 10 existing cathodic protection test station terminal boards.

The Bidding Process

The Cathodic Protection System Improvements Project was advertised for bids on August 18, 2020. Two bids were received and opened on September 23, 2020 from EXARO Technologies Corporation (EXARO) and American Construction & Supply, Inc. (AMS). EXARO was the apparent low bidder. AMS, the second low bidder, submitted a bid protest on September 30, 2020 alleging that EXARO did not meet the bid document's Company Experience requirement of deep anode well installation to a depth of 150 feet or more. While the bid protest raised concerns about the experience of EXARO, it was difficult to find EXARO non-responsible, which would be required to uphold the bid protest. Therefore, in light of the bid protest and EXARO's response and the fact that both bids were over the engineer's estimate, the Board on November 9, 2020 rejected all bids received for this project and authorized staff to re-bid it.

After the bids were rejected, staff and District's legal counsel modified the experience and qualifications requirements to allow bidders to list subcontractors to meet the drilling requirements for deep anode wells of cathodic protection systems.

The Project was re-advertised for bids on March 2, 2021. Three bids were received and opened on March 30, 2021 with the results shown as follows:

The Board awarded the construction contract for the Project to Corrpro in the amount of \$483,800. Staff hired Carollo Engineers, Inc. (Carollo) to provide construction management and

inspection services for the Project. The contract with Carollo was combined with the Emergency Outfall Improvements Project and the FY21 Gravity Sewer Rehabilitation/Replacement Project - Phase VII.

Previous Board Action

April 22, 2019, the Board rejected all bids received for the Newark Pump Station Cathodic Protection System Upgrade Project and authorized staff to re-bid the project.

June 24, 2019, the Board rejected the sole bid received for the Newark Pump Station Cathodic Protection System Upgrade Project.

November 9, 2020, the Board rejected all bids received for the Cathodic Protection System Improvements Project and authorized staff to re-bid the project.

April 26, 2021, the Board awarded the construction contract for the Cathodic Protection System Improvements Project to Corrpro Companies, Inc. in the amount of \$483,800.

May 10, 2021, the Board authorized the General Manager to execute Task Order No. 2 with V&A Consulting Engineers, Inc. in the amount of \$30,854 to provide engineering services during construction of the Project.

June 14, 2021, the Board authorized the General Manager to execute an agreement and Task Order No. 1 with Carollo Engineers, Inc. in the amount of \$306,453 to provide construction management services for the Emergency Outfall Improvements Project, Cathodic Protection System Improvements Project, and FY21 Gravity Sewer Rehabilitation/Replacement Project – Phase VII.

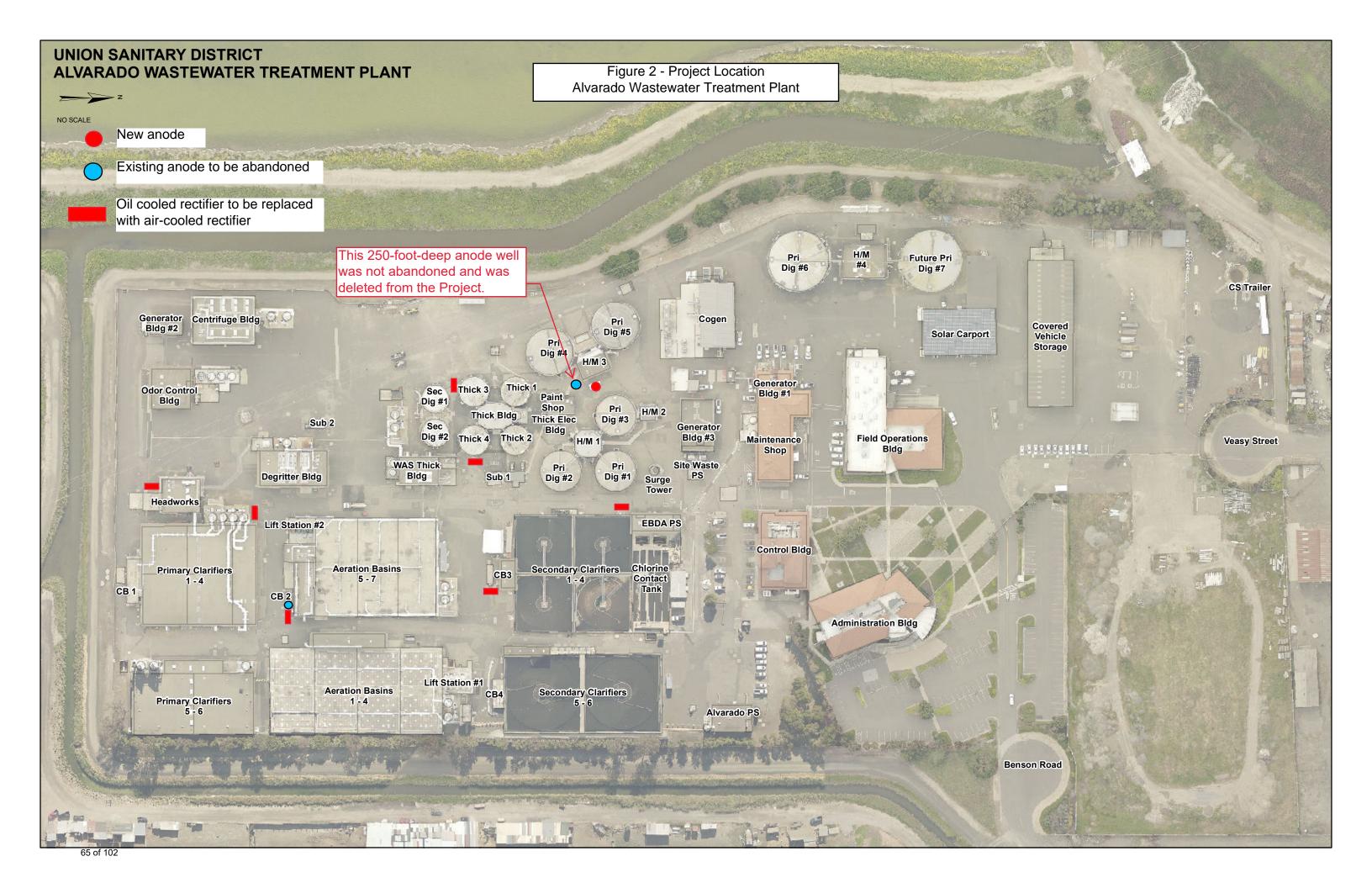

Recommendation

- 1. Receive an update from the General Manager on the District's COVID-19 response and staffing levels.
- 2. Adopt the attached resolution authorizing the use of teleconference meetings in compliance with AB 361.

Discussion

AB 361 requires public agencies to make findings by majority vote within 30 days of the first teleconferenced meeting under AB 361 and every 30 days thereafter that a state of emergency still exists and continues to directly impact the ability of the members to meet safely in person, or that officials continue to impose or recommend measures to promote social distancing.

As directed by the Board on September 27, 2021, the District is continuing to hold teleconferenced meetings as allowed under AB 361 due to the ongoing public health threat of COVID-19. The Board adopted resolutions at every Board meeting starting on October 25, 2021, authorizing the use of teleconference meetings. At the Board meeting of March 28, 2022, the Board directed staff to continue scheduling teleconference meeting for committees and to phase-in in-person meetings for the Board for the months of April and May and revisit in-person meetings at the first Board meeting in June. During the phase-in, meetings have continued to be held via teleconference although Board members may attend in-person. At the Board meeting of June 13, 2022, the Board directed staff to continue with meetings via teleconference in the same manner as they have been held during the past few months and to bring back a proposal for upgrading the Boardroom for hybrid meetings to the July 25 Board meeting.

The attached resolution includes and reaffirms the findings required by AB 361 to allow the District to continue to hold teleconferenced meetings. This agenda item also includes the COVID-19 Update from the General Manager.

Background

AB 361 was signed into law by the Governor on September 16, 2021, and amends the Brown Act to allow local legislative bodies to continue using teleconferencing and virtual meeting technology as long as there is a "proclaimed state of emergency" by the Governor. This allowance also depends on state or local officials imposing or recommending measures that promote social distancing or a legislative body finding that meeting in person would present an imminent safety risk to attendees. Though adopted in the context of the pandemic, AB 361 will allow for virtual meetings during other proclaimed emergencies, such as earthquakes or wildfires, where physical attendance may present a risk.

AB 361 prohibits councils and boards from limiting public comments to those submitted in advance of the meeting and specifies that the legislative body "must provide an opportunity for the public to ... offer comment in real time." (Government Code 54953(e)(2)(E).

Additionally, the body must allow a reasonable time for public comment during the comment periods. The District allows for email comments to be submitted throughout Board meeting and the Board Clerk checks for emails continuously, including during the public comment portion for each agenda item.

The agenda must include information on the manner in which the public may access the meeting and provide comments remotely. AB 361 provides that if technical problems arise that result in the public's access being disrupted, the legislative body may not take any vote or other official action until the technical disruption is corrected and public access is restored.

In addition, as noted in the Discussion section above, AB 361 requires public agencies to make findings by majority vote within 30 days of the first teleconferenced meeting under AB 361 and every 30 days thereafter that a state of emergency still exists and continues to directly impact the ability of the members to meet safely in person, or that officials continue to impose or recommend measures to promote social distancing. AB 361 will sunset on January 1, 2024.

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS AUTHORIZING THE USE OF TELECONFERENCE MEETINGS IN COMPLIANCE WITH AB 361

WHEREAS, the Union Sanitary District is committed to preserving and nurturing public access and participation in meetings of the Board of Directors; and

WHEREAS, all meetings of Union Sanitary District's legislative bodies are open and public, as required by the Ralph M. Brown Act (Cal. Gov. Code 54950 – 54963); and

WHEREAS, the Brown Act, Government Code section 54953(e), makes provisions for remote teleconferencing participation in meetings by members of a legislative body, without compliance with the requirements of Government Code section 54953(b)(3), subject to the existence of certain conditions; and

WHEREAS, Government Code 54953(e) permits teleconferencing in the event that a state of emergency is declared by the Governor pursuant to Government Code section 8625, and that either state or local officials have imposed or recommended measures to promote social distancing, or that the legislative body finds that meeting in person would present imminent risks to the health and safety of attendees; and

WHEREAS, such conditions now exist in the District; and

WHEREAS, on March 4, 2020, Governor Newsom issued a Proclamation of a State of Emergency in response to the rapid spread of the highly contagious disease known as COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, on August 3, 2021, the Health Officer of the County of Alameda adopted Order No. 21-03 stating that the Delta variant has been circulating in the County, is highly transmissible in indoor settings and requires multi-component prevention strategies to prevent spread, and that hospitalizations are increasing; and

WHEREAS, despite ongoing efforts to promote masking and vaccinations, COVID-19 continues to threaten the health and lives of the public, especially with the existence of the Delta variant, which is highly transmissible in indoor settings, the Omicron variant, which is even more transmissible than the Delta variant, and new Omicron sub-variants, and increasing cases in Alameda County; and

WHEREAS, the increased risk of contracting COVID-19 associated with being indoors with others has caused, and will continue to cause, conditions of peril to the safety of persons within the District that are likely to be beyond the control of services, personnel, equipment, and facilities of the District; and

WHEREAS, on October 25, 2021, the Board adopted Resolution No. 2937, authorizing the use of teleconference meetings in compliance with AB 361; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, BY THE UNION SANITARY DISTRICT BOARD OF DIRECTORS, AS FOLLOWS:

1. The above recitals are true and correct and are material to this Resolution and are incorporated into this Resolution as findings of the District Board.

- 2. The Union Sanitary District Board finds and declares that the circumstances set forth in Government Code section 54953(e)(1), exist because the State of Emergency continues to exist and meeting in person would present imminent risks to the health and safety of attendees.
- 3. Pursuant to the requirements of Government Code Section 54953(e)(3), the District Board makes the following findings:
 - (a) The District Board has considered the circumstances of the continuing state of emergency;
 - (b) The state of emergency continues to directly impact the ability of the members and the public to meet safely in person;
 - (c) Due to COVID-19, holding meetings in person will present imminent risks to the health and safety to attendees; and
 - (d) The District Board will continue to meet by teleconference in accordance with Government Code section 54953(e).
- 4. The aforementioned findings apply to all committees and subcommittees of the District which are classified as legislative bodies pursuant to Government Code Section 54952.
- 5. The District Board will reconsider every 30 days, the circumstances of the emergency and review whether it continues to directly impact the ability of the members to meet safely in person.
- 6. If any section, subsection, subdivision, sentence, clause, phrase, or portion of this Resolution is, for any reason, held to be invalid or unconstitutional by the decision of any court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this Resolution. The Board hereby declares that it would have adopted this Resolution and each and every section, subsection, subdivision, sentence, clause, phrase, or portion thereof, irrespective of the fact that any one or more sections, subsections, subdivisions, sentences, clauses, phrases, or portions thereof be declared unconstitutional.
 - 7. This Resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption.

WHEREAS ON September 30. 2021 Governor WHEREAS, on September 30, 2021, Governor Gavin Newsom signed into law Assembly Bill 481 relating to the use of military equipment by California law enforcement agencies; and WHEREAS, Assembly Bill 481 seeks to provide WHEREAS, Assembly Bill 481 seeks to provide transparency, oversight, and an opportunity for meaningful public input on decisions regarding whether and how military equipment is funded, acquired, or used by law enforcement agencies; and WHEREAS, Assembly Bill 481, codified at California Government Code section 7070, et. seq., requires law enforcement agencies to obtain approval of the applicable governing body, by an ordinance adopting a "military equipment" use policy, at a regular meeting held pursuant to open meeting laws, prior to taking certain actions relating to the funding, acquisition, or use of military equipment. The term "military equipment" is defined in California Government Code section 7070 subdivision (c); and 7070 subdivision (c); and WHEREAS, the Newark Police Department is in

WHEREAS, it is newark Folice Department is in possession of certain items of equipment that may qualify as "military equipment" under Assembly Bill 481; and WHEREAS, Assembly Bill 481 requires that a

law enforcement agency possessing and using such qualifying equipment prepare a publicly released, written, military equipment use policy. The policy must be a document covering the inventory, description, purpose, use, acquisition, purpose, use, acquisition, purpose, use, acquisition, purpose, use, acquisition, acquistropuse, fixed impacts, precedures training.

inventory, description, purpose, use, acquisition, maintenance, fiscal impacts, procedures, training, oversight, and complaint process, applicable to the Department's use of such equipment; and WHEREAS, Assembly Bill 481 allows the governing body of a city to approve the military equipment use policy for continued or future funding, acquisition, or use of military equipment within its jurisdiction only if it makes specified determinations specified in Government Code Section 7071 subdivision (d); and WHEREAS, the military equipment use policy and supporting information must, upon adoption by ordinance, thereafter be approved by the governing body by ordinance and reviewed annually; and

annually; and WHEREAS, the proposed military equipment use

WHEREAS, the proposed military equipment use policy, including military equipment inventory, has been prepared by the Newark Police Department and identified as Policy 709; and WHEREAS, Policy 709 was published on the Newark Police Department's internet website 30 days prior to the public hearing concerning the military equipment at issue in compliance with Government Code Section 7071(b); and WHEREAS, the Newark Police Department commenced the approval process prior to May 1, 2022, in accordance with Assembly Bill 481; and WHEREAS, the Policy 709 was presented to City Council at a public hearing on May 26, 2022; and WHEREAS, the Policy 709 meets the requirements of California Government Code the requirements of California Government Code

the requirements of California Government Code Section 7070(di); and WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Newark, having received the information required under Assembly Bill 481 regarding the Newark Police Department's use of military equipment as defined in said law, and makes the specified determinations required under Government Code Section 7071(d), deems it to be in the best interest of the City to approve the Newark Police Department's Military Equipment Funding, Acquisition and Use Policy as set forth herein. THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NEWARK DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS: SECTION 1. Recitals. The above recitals are true and correct

Recitals. The above recitals are true and correct and made a part of this Ordinance. SECTION 2. Determinations. Based on the findings above, in addition to information provided findings above, in addition to information provided to the City Council at the public meeting, the City Council determines as follows: The Newark Police Department's Military Equipment Use Policy is necessary because there are no reasonable alternatives that can achieve the same objectives of officer and civilian safety. The Newark Police Department's Military Equipment Use Policy will safeguard the public's welfare, safety, civil rights, and civil liberties. The military equipment identified in the Newark Police Department's Military Equipment Use Policy is reasonably cost Military Equipment Use Policy is reasonably cost effective compared to available alternatives that effective compared to available alternatives that can achieve the same objectives of officer and civilian safety. Prior military equipment use by the Newark Police Department complied with the Military Equipment Use Policy although it was not yet in effect at the time, or if prior uses did not comply with the accompanying military equipment use policy, corrective action has been taken to use procedy managers, and ensure future.

remedy nonconforming uses and ensure future compliance. The Newark Police Department Military Equipment Use Policy, Policy 709, setting forth the City's military equipment use policy is approved and adopted SECTION 3. Addition of Chapter 2.50. Chapter 2.50, Military Equipment Use Policy, is added to the Newark Municipal Code as follows: "Chapter 2.50 Military Equipment Use Policy, Pursuant to Government Code Section 7071(d), the City Council has made the following determinations: The military equipment inventoried and presented to the City Council is necessary because there is no reasonable alternative that can achieve the same objective of officer and civilian safety; The proposed military equipment use policy ("Policy") will safeguard the public's welfare, safety, civil rights, and civil liberties; The equipment is reasonably cost effective compared to available SECTION 3. Addition of Chapter 2.50. Chapter reasonably cost effective compared to available alternatives that can achieve the same objective alternativés that can achieve the same objective of officer and civilian safety (if any); and Prior military equipment use complied with the applicable equipment use policy (which included equipment now defined as military equipment) that was in effect at the time, or if prior uses did not comply with the accompanying military equipment use policy, corrective action has been taken to remedy nonconforming uses and ensure future compliance. The Police Department has submitted a proposed Policy to the City Council identified as Newark Police Department Policy 709 and has made those documents available on the Police Department's website for at least 709 and has made those documents available on the Police Department's website for at least 30 days prior to the public hearing concerning the military equipment at issue. The Policy was considered by the City Council as an agenda item in an open session of a regular meeting, noticed in accordance with the Ralph M. Brown Act, at which public comment was permitted. The Policy shall be made publicly available on the Police Department's website for as long as the military equipment is available for use. The Police Department shall submit an annual military equipment report to the City Council, containing equipment report to the City Council, containing the information required in Government Code Section 7072, and the City Council shall determine whether each type of military equipment identified in that report has complied with the standards for in that report has complied with the standards for approval set forth in (a)(1)-(4) above. The City Council shall review this ordinance, and vote on whether to renew it, on an annual basis at a regular meeting, in accordance with Government Code Section 7071(e)(2). The City Council approves the use of the Policy identified as Newark Police Department Policy 709, and finds that it satisfies the requirements of Government Code Section 7070(d)."

SECTION 4. Severability. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase of this ordinance is for any reason held to be invalid or unconstitutional by a decision of any court of competent jurisdiction, such decision will not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this

of competent jurisdiction, such decision will not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this ordinance. The City Council hereby declares that it would have passed this ordinance and each of every section, subsection, sentence, clause, or phrase not declared invalid or unconstitutional without regard to whether any portion of the ordinance would be subsequently declared invalid or unconstitutional. SECTION 5. CEQA. Approval of the ordinance is exempt from further environmental review under the general rule in California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) Guidelines Section 15061(b) (3) that CEQA only applies to projects that have the potential for causing a significant effect on the environment. As a series of text amendments and additions that do not authorize any new activity, additions that do not authorize any new activity t can be seen with certainty that there is noossibility that the ordinance will have a significant

possibility that the ordinance will have a significant effect on the environment. SECTION 6. Publication and effective date. Within fifteen (15) days from and after adoption, this Ordinance shall be published once in the Tri-City Voice, a newspaper of general circulation printed and published in Alameda County and circulated in the City of Newark, in accordance with California Government Code Section 36933. This Ordinance shall take effect and be enforced thirty (30) days after its adoption.
